LET'S TELL YOU LAND SEA

The LandSea project aims to increase the professional skills and the ability of the actors interested in the development of the coastal strips to promote together the agricultural sector (activities, products) and the maritime sector (fishing and livestock) through innovation, the creation of new generating activities of income and the enhancement of its products.

The project includes:

- the preparation of training contents for the joint enhancement of land-sea products and the development of a self-assessment tool.
- the development of the LandSea guide which will provide a methodology to design, in a participatory way, LandSea discovery circuits suitable for each territory.
- the construction of a LandSea e-learning platform on which the training contents will be digitized to offer a free online learning path.

The project is funded by the Erasmus + program and is implemented by an international partnership made up of seven partners from six countries: Cyprus, Bulgaria, France, Italy, Spain and Greece. The project leader is the French cooperative Petra Patrimonia.

PARTNER'S ACTIVITIES

The analysis of the context in Corsica led to the selection of the territory of the Natural Regional Park of Corsica as a pilot for the Land Sea project. A set of actors have been met andinterviewed, the Park's project manager, the Pole of Territorial Equilibrium of Valinco, fishermen's associations and local territorial developers, in order to identify the needs of local fisheries and agriculture actors.

A first meeting was organized on September 20th by **Petra Patrimonia** to share and validate the contents of the project, especially the key skills to set up circuits for the valorisation of land and sea products. This approach will be carried out in complementarity with the current activities of the Park in terms of reinforcement of the local productions in the channels of short circuits.

PCX met in July and August 2022 with local stakeholders from the marine farming and agriculture sector in order to investigate the situation of these sectors in different provincesof Cyprus and the utilization of land-sea products. The representatives of these sectorswere farmers, livestock farmers, fishermen, aquaculture and agriculture experts and traders.

In addition, extensive research was carried outon the skills needed to combine land-sea products as well as on how to market these products to potential customers.

The meetings made an important contribution to the territorial analysis of marine farming and agriculture in Cyprus and the results will serve as the basis for the further development of theLandSea training content.

The analysis of the territory, provided by **Zaragoza University**, together with the selection of local actors, involved an exploratory study in which synchronous and remote oral communication was essential. Aragon is made up of 3 provinces and the project has tried to address all of them, especially Teruel, a region with a lot of agricultural and tourist potential, but which may be somewhat neglected. Also, we taked into account on of themost important river in the Iberian Peninsula, the Ebro River, due to we believe that it is a key resource that required improve and adequate, its Agricola and touristic role. Another interesting point, got to observation was the alliances and commercial relations that make a strong link with the Basque country in terms of aquaticresources, with special emphasis on fishing. The very reality of the Euskadi (Basque Country), in addition to its status as a strategic partner to Aragon, makes it an interesting territory that is perfectly aligned with the strategic objectives of the LandSea project.
